

The Corrine Camilleri-Ferrante Prize*

Applications are invited from East Midlands trainees for the Corrine Camilleri-Ferrante Award. First prize will be £1000 to be used for attendance at an education, leadership or research conference with a second prize of £250 for attendance at an educational meeting or for the purchase of educational material. In addition, the winner and runner up will receive a certificate which will be invaluable evidence for their portfolio.

The purpose of the prize is to encourage trainees with an interest in leadership, education or research, and the winner will deliver one of the keynote speeches at the Annual Symposium of Senior Educators being held in Kegworth on 1st May 2019. The theme of the conference is Looking into the Crystal Ball – The Future of Medical Education and the winner will be asked to speak on the topic of ‘What medicine will be like when I retire’.

*Corrine Camilleri-Ferrante (1954-2015) was the first Head of the School of Public Health Medicine in the East Midlands.
