| <p>The FY2 doctor will spend one week on an induction comprising of reading policies, clinical system training and spending time with all staff. After the initial induction and assessment of competence the F2 doctor will see patients who are classed as minor illness only. Appointment times start at 30 minutes and reduced to 20 minutes when thought to be competent to cope with this. There is protected debriefing time in each surgery and slots for the GPs to answer questions. The practice is a training practice with one foundation trainer and one GP trainer and one associate trainers. There is no on call or extended hours surgeries for the foundation doctor. The foundation doctor will be given opportunity to be included in home visiting as it is essential part of general practice.</p> | | | | | |

| <p>The foundation doctor is expected to attend the GP speciality training afternoon on a Wednesday and the foundation teaching sessions on Thursday lunchtime. The remainder of Thursday is used for self directed learning. There are other educational activities eg MDT and a protected learning afternoon (monthly) scheduled which the foundation doctor can attend.</p> | | | | | |

| <p>The practice has a strong educational and multiprofessional approach to delivering primary care. Our team includes 7 GPs, two advanced nurse practioners, 6 practice nurses and 6 healthcare workers. We also have a clinical pharmacist part time and have recruited a full time recently start date to be confirmed.
