OVERVIEW OF THE CHOICES COURSES

Effective & Efficient Consultations

A one day course focused on effective and time-efficient consultations with patients and their relatives. By F2 you have been managing your own patients and experiencing some real-world challenges that medical school may not have fully prepared you for. There are specialty specific challenges in effective use of consultation time for all doctors in ALL specialties.

Care of the Critically III Medical Patient (CRIMP)

This two day course is delivered using a blend of lectures, workshops, patient scenarios and skill stations. It will give you a structured approach to assessing the medically ill patient and topics include respiratory emergencies, blood gasses, endocrine emergencies, airway management, chest drains, lumbar punctures and much more!

Because this is a two day course, you will need to use one of your taster days to attend.

Paediatric Acute Illness Management

This one day course is a blend of lectures, workshops and simulated learning which embeds the ABCDE approach to assessment and management of acutely ill children who are at risk of deterioration. It will cover assessment and initial treatment of children with various conditions including breathing difficulties, circulatory problems, neurological problems and those in pain or with sepsis.

Surgical Skills

This one-day course will help you to recognise and assess the acutely ill surgical patient, identify common causes of acute illness in the surgical patient and deliver appropriate initial therapy, recognise the importance of coexistent chronic and co-morbid disease in the assessment of the high risk surgical pre-operative patient and develop practical skills to enable the trainee to work effectively within a number of clinical settings.

Teaching Skills

This interactive one day course will give you a practical introduction to teaching. The course aims to increase your understanding of teaching theory and how to structure and plan a teaching session. You will get an opportunity to design and deliver a short teaching session in a safe, supportive environment and receive constructive feedback.

Introduction to Mentoring

This course has a seminar format for maximum interactivity. Being a successful mentor or mentee needs the elaboration of individual skills and understanding and this training day is designed and run to allow each attendee to enhance their skills and develop a focused action plan for their own needs. There will be a mix of mentoring theory and practical exercises.
