 When 'free' see ward referrals, all patients admitted on DMARD & chase bloods. Organise GCA referrals as a point of urgency i.e. if it is my day on the ward I must leave. Departmental activities, seeing referrals, teaching medical students. Other Comments (if appropriate): There is a lot of admin (calling patients, booking appointments, chasing notes etc) You can go to Dermatology clinics, extra Rheumatology or ward-based work. You will be part of the general medical on call rota, working either day or night shifts with the post attracting a 40% pay banding currently. The shifts start and end with a full 30 minute handover between the day and night teams. We have recently introduced a Hospital @ Night team to support the on call team out of hours. In addition, there is a dedicated on call cardiology service and Kettering is the Primary PCI centre for the county. We also have a dedicated GI bleed rota delivered by our consultant gastroenterologists out of hours.
