Main duties:

As part of this job you will be responsible for the admission and ongoing care of patients admitted to Aston Ward, Bradgate Mental Health Unit, for detoxification and / or stabilisation from alcohol and drug misuse. Your role will include the medical assessment of admissions and prescription of detoxification regimens, which you will receive training and supervision in. You will be invited to take part in clerking psychiatric admissions to Aston ward and to attend and participate in the Mental Health Ward Round.

You will have the opportunity to train in the treatment of individuals with alcohol and drug misuse, alongside developing skills in the treatment of general adult psychiatric patients.

As part of your post you will participate in the on-call rota of the Bradgate Mental Health Unit, providing outof-hours medical cover to the wards based at the Bradgate Unit. You will receive further information in relation to this at your induction to the trust.
