Main duties:				

The trainee will clerk patients, assess mental and physical states, monitor progress of the patients' mental health and response to treatement, obtain collateral histories and liaise with colleagues in other teams. The trainee will have a fairly flexible timetable and will need to work closely with the team to prioritise taks and resources. Individual learning objectives will be agreed at the beginning of the placement with the Clinical Supervisor. A mid-point review will be held with the Foundation Programme associate tutor. The trainee will work as an integral part of the multi-disciplinary team. The trainee will clerk patients, assess mental and physical states, monitor progress of the patients' mental health and response to treatment, obtain colateral histories and liaise with colleagues in other teams. The trainee will have a fairly flexible timetable and will need to work closely with the team to priortise taks and resources. There will be opporunities to improve skills in psychopathology assessment, the management of a range of disorders, the interface between physical and mental healthcare and assessment of capacity. The trainee will manage a number of conditions, including severe Mood Disorders, Psychoses (including Schizophrenia, transient and druginduced) and Personality Disorders as well as other conditions. The trainee will have an opportunity to participate in the ECT rota at QMC and receive direct supervision and training. A consultant pshychiatrist is responsible for ECT at QMC. The trianee will have the opportunity to shadow Core/GPVTS trainees on the Nottingham on-call rota, including exposure to acute admissions to the psychiatric wards (CAMHS, Adult, PICU, LD, Old-Age, perinatal etc), urgent review of in patients (inc. Section 5(2) assessments), and out of hours liaison assessments requested by the Nottingham University Hospitals Trust. Foundation year 2 trainees will take part in the on call rota. Year 1 trainees do not but can shadow as described above. The trainee will continue to attend the Foundation Training Programme. A weekly journal club/case conference is also held weekly and the trainee will be involved in presenting to these meetings. There will also be an opportunity to teach medical students on an informal or formal basis. At all times you will have ready access to senior clinicians to discuss cases as needed. You will also receive regular supervision from your clinical supervisor. The trainee will be involved in the audit process of the team and will have the opportunity to develop their own topics and present them at the audit meeting. The trainee's progress throughout the placement will be supported by workplace bases assessments.
