Simple procedures, looking for and addressing complications of medical conditions, assessing National Early Warning Scores (NEWS) and dealing with the sick patient, safety issues and audit opportunities, prioritizing work in a busy environment, being on-call and dealing with/presenting new admissions to the consultants and dealing with inpatient emergencies on call.</p>
