<p>Emergency on-call: (a) clerking and managing new admissions; (b) arranging and interpreting diagnostic investigations; (c) attending twice daily emergency consultant ward rounds (d) assisting in theatre when required</p> <p>Elective and emergency inpatients: (a) pre-clerking elective patients including organising relevant pre-op investigations in conjunction with anaesthetist (three sessions per week) (b) attending daily morning business rounds (c) arranging and interpreting diagnostic investigations; (d) assisting in theatre when required</p> <p>On call arrangements: Surgery on call is not part of the hospital at night scheme. General surgery on call includes two F1s on-call on long days 7 days a week (1 in 4) and two F1 on-call nights 7 days a week with support from FY2s, CT and ST trainees.</p>
