Main duties:

- Day to day care and management of patients with both acute and chronic problems.
- Review of emergency admissions and institution of appropriate treatment
- Clinical method (history taking, patient assessment and examination, and differential diagnosis.
- Presentation of patient information on ward rounds
- Undertake effective handover to ensure continuity of patient care
- In conjunction with senior colleagues, development of management plans for patients.
- Administration of appropriate treatments and therapeutics.
- Arranging diagnostic tests and investigations for patients, and checking and acting on results.
- Working with and as part of Multi Disciplinary Teams, making appropriate use of the skills of allied health professionals and specialist nurses.
- Liaison with wider hospital services and departments, including laboratory, pharmacy, pain, and infection control teams
- Ensuring treatment and investigative schedules are implemented and reviewed.
- Completion of timely and accurate documentation, including writing up out-patient and in-patient cases, death certification and discharge
- Undertaking surgical procedures as prescribed in the curriculum including transfusions, and assisting senior colleagues in theatre.
- There maybe opportunities to learn more advanced skills such as lumbar puncture and insertion of chest and peritoneal drains and central
- Providing teaching for Medical Students and supporting them so that they integrate into the work of the unit.
- Work within established protocols for clinical care, and to relevant policies and procedures.
